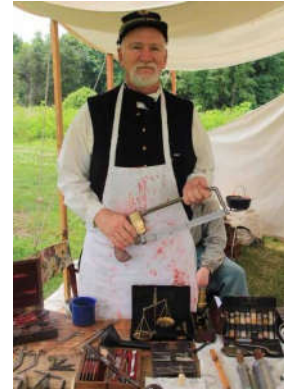


## George Spangler Farm & Field House Season Opening

The [George Spangler Farm & Field Hospital Site](#) will be opening Friday through Sunday in the summer months beginning June 7. The [George Spangler Farm](#) is the best surviving example of a farm used as a corps field hospital during the battle of Gettysburg. Access to the farm is via shuttle from the [Gettysburg National Military Park Museum & Visitor Center](#). The shuttle bus travels to and from the [Museum & Visitor Center](#) three times each hour, beginning at 10 am with the final shuttle returning to the Visitor Center at 3:20 pm.

## New Exhibit on Display at the Gettysburg National Military Park Museum & Visitor Center

We are excited to announce a new exhibit has been added to the July 2 gallery in the [Gettysburg Museum of the American Civil War](#) at the [Gettysburg National Military Park Museum & Visitor Center](#). Acquired in 2016 by the [Gettysburg Foundation](#) on behalf of the [Gettysburg National Military Park](#), this dress (frock) coat belonged to Corporal William A. Henderson of Company K, 1st U.S. Sharpshooters and was with him at the Battle of Gettysburg. Among the uniforms of the Civil War, this coat is one of the most celebrated, unique and rare. The green frock coat devised by



the regiment's founder, Colonel Hiram Berdan, "correspond to the leafy season with the colors of the foliage". It is believed to provide one of the U.S. Army's first documented forms of camouflage.

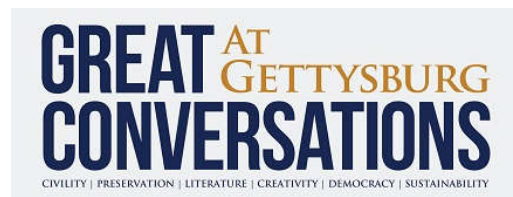
